## SHERIDAN TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING MINUTES

Minutes of the Regular Meeting, September 19, 2023, held at the Sheridan Township Hall at 7:00 p.m. Present were Corliss Gulembo, Marlynn Gulembo, Jennie Borema, Jeff Cormany, Doug Damkoehler, and 12 guests.

Pledge to the Flag.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer's report was given. Motion to approve by Cormany, supported by Damkoehler; carried.

Clerk reported that the Clerk's and Treasurer's books balance at \$207,937.76, prior to the meeting.

Sheriff Cole presented the July and August activity reports. There were 13 calls in July, and 10 in August. Regarding the situation at Vaughn Payne's residence, Sheriff Cole invited local agencies to meet at the property to inspect. Adult Protective Services would not come out. Zoning went, but stated that we are not in the Junk Authority so they couldn't do anything. There are no windows in the trailer. Someone living there is collecting monthly rent money from Adult Protective Services. Vaughn is in a Mason County nursing home. Sheriff is hoping to get permission to enter the property from Vaughn and evict those living there. Zoning offered a dumpster, but those living on the property weren't interested. Sheriff Cole announced an informational meeting on November 10, from 6-7:30 p.m. at MCC. Deputy Gomez from Idaho will give a presentation on the signs of human trafficking.

Commissioner Ron Bacon reported that SROs are all in place. The Robin Grant went through for Great Lakes Energy internet project.

Assessor Mike Banninga reported that there have been 8 new houses built in the township.

Ed Lijewski from the Fountain Fire Department reported that they have had 22 calls since last month, 181 total for the year.

Clerk presented correspondence which included a website activity report and site review paperwork for Cold Stream Farm, LLC, from EGLE.

Brine contract was discussed. The third brining has not been done as of today. Cormany will check on the cost for the third brine. If the total is \$52,000, then he will tell the Road Commission to do the brining. If it is going to be an additional \$20,000, then skip it. Motion by M. Gulembo, support by C. Gulembo, carried.

Cormany reported that the millings on Echo Lane and Benson will be done this week. We received a bill for Benson Rd. Motion by Damkoehler, supported by C. Gulembo, to hold the payment until next month. Motion carried.

Motion to pay bills, by Cormany, supported by Damkoehler; carried.

Motion to adjourn by Borema, supported by M. Gulembo; carried.
