

SHERIDAN TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING
MINUTES

Minutes of the Regular Meeting, April 16, 2024, held at the Sheridan Township Hall at 7:00 p.m. Present were Corliss Gulembo, Marlynn Gulembo, Jennie Borema, Jeffery Cormany, and 16 guests.

Pledge to the Flag.

Clerk read minutes of last meeting. Hearing no corrections, the minutes were approved.

Treasurer's report was given; motion to approve by Cormany, supported by C. Gulembo; carried.

Clerk reported that the Clerk's and Treasurer's books balance at \$264,953.57, prior to the meeting.

Sheriff Cole reported 8 calls in the Township in March. He also reported that the Marine Patrol will be at the Fireworks on Round Lake on July 5. 9-1-1 will not be running a millage.

Ed Lyjewski, representing the Fountain Fire Department, reported that there have been 35 fire calls so far in 2024.

Assessor Mike Banninga presented Board of Review minutes to the Clerk.

Nancy Vandervest introduced herself and presented information for the open Assessor position.

Becky Lederer, a candidate for Prosecutor, introduced herself and asked for our support.

Howard Tripp, who lives on N. 8th St., voice his concerns regarding the cars, dump trucks, and RVs in the Bovee property front yard. He stated that his water is contaminated, and another neighbor buried garbage in his yard with a plow (Decker Rd.). Cindy Blain, who lives next to Bovee, shares Tripp's concerns. They have come to the Township asking for help in getting the mess in the area cleaned up. Supervisor will ask Zoning to attend our next meeting. He will also try to have the three candidates running for Prosecutor in attendance. He asked the residents to bring a detailed list of their concerns.

Clerk announced the Mason County Township Officers' Association will meet on April 18 at Custer Township.

Clerk reminded those in attendance that Clean-Up Day is on June 1, 8 a.m. – noon, at the Township Park.

Treasurer will check into reinvesting the township perpetual care CDs at a higher rate.

Motion to adjourn by Borema, supported by M. Gulembo; carried.
