

SHERIDAN TOWNSHIP BOARD MEETING
MINUTES

Minutes of the Regular Meeting, January 20, 2026, held at the Sheridan Township Hall at 7:00 p.m. Present were Supervisor Kelly Crocker, Clerk Marlynn Gulembo, Treasurer Jennie Borema, Trustee Jennifer Tyndall, Trustee Rich Rouwhorst, and 12 guests.

Pledge to the Flag.

Minutes of the last regular board meeting were sent to Board members prior to the meeting. Motion to approve by Crocker, second by Tyndall ; carried.

Treasurer's report was given. Motion to approve by Crocker, supported Rouwhorst; carried.

Clerk reported that the Clerk's and Treasurer's books balance at \$90,426.25, prior to the meeting.

Assessor Nancy Vandervest reported that the 2026 assessment roll is at the County for pre-audit. Assessment change notices will be mailed the end of February.

Mason County Senior Services Coordinator, Susan Evans, presented information on the Friendly Caller Program. There will be a Volunteer Orientation on Wednesday, February 25 at 1 p.m. at the Mason County Airport.

Ed Lyjewski reported that the Fountain Fire Department received 249 calls in 2025, and 14 so far this month.

Sheriff Cole presented the activity report for December and the yearly report for 2025. There were 904 inmates booked, and the total average daily inmate population for 2025 was 86.

In old business, there was no update on hall tables. Supervisor suggested that we look into Municipal Underwriters for insurance.

Board of Review dates were re-approved, with a correction made to one of the dates. Motion to approve by Crocker, supported by Tyndall; carried.

Crocker reported on the Junk Authority/Ordinance. Chris Kotecki will bill the township per case, and we would have to make a 2-year commitment. Motion by Crocker to join the Junk Authority, supported by Borema, to adopt the Junk Ordinance. Roll call vote: Ayes: Crocker, Gulembo, Borema, Tyndall, Rouwhorst
Nays: None

Supervisor declared the Ordinance adopted. Clerk will check on what we need to do next.

Crocker reported on the Supervisors' meeting. She checked with other townships regarding the cost for signs going in Ford Lake Estates and found that their townships had to pay for new yield/stop signs.

In new business, Clerk reported that she has signed the Early Voting Site Agreement naming Custer Township Hall as the EV site. She also announced that the Election Commission needs to meet at 6:45 p.m. on February 17 to discuss and adopt the Resolution to Establish Receiving Board for Early Voting.

Motion to pay bills by Crocker, supported by Tyndall; carried.

Motion to adjourn by Borema, supported by Gulembo; carried.
